

Wild and Wonderful Birds at Wings of the World

Wings of the World is a free-flight bird exhibit, which means I will get to see beautiful birds up close. I can even feed them! Wings of the World is at the south end of the Philly Zoo right by the train ride.

Entering Wings of the World

We might have to wait our turn to enter Wings of the World. A Zoo staff person will let me and my family in and ask us to wipe our feet on the rug before we come in. They will also remind me to not bring in any food or drink.

While we wait, I will hear the music playing around the area, the bell or horn from the train, I might also see and hear other people walking around, maybe I will even hear birds calling!



Entering Wings of the World

The Zoo staff member will give us some worms to feed the birds. The worms will be in a little cup. I should let my parent or guardian hold the cup until we are ready to feed the birds inside.

Before we go inside, the staff member will tell me some important rules. I should stay on the path and not chase or touch any of the birds.

We will wait here until the staff member opens the door.

Once we go through, we will walk through big curtains. If this is scary, my parent or guardian can push through curtains for me.



Feeding the birds

When I am ready, my parent or guardian can give me some live worms from the cup. The worms may wiggle in my hand.

There are all types of beautiful birds inside and if I have any questions, I can always ask the nice staff person inside. Maybe I can even ask them what their favorite bird is, or how to feed the birds.

I can hold the worms in my hand and wait for the birds to come and eat them out of my hand. I need to remember the birds can't hurt me. They are just excited to eat.



Exiting the Exhibit

After we have walked through the path, we will exit. We should remember to wash our hands when we exit and throw out our cups in any trash can. From there, I can either explore more of the Zoo or go home. What a great day at the Philadelphia Zoo!
